Situation Report on Extremely Severe Cyclonic Storm – 'FANI'

Date: 04.05.2019, Time: 10.00 AM

1. Present Status of 'FANI'

As per information from IMD, the Extremely Severe Cyclonic Storm 'FANI' crossed Odisha coast close to Puri between 0800 and 1000 hrs with maximum wind speed of around 175 KMPH. Thereafter, the system moved to Khordha district with high wind and heavy rainfall in the district including Bhubaneswar before moving northwards to Cuttack, Jagatsinghpur, Bhadrak & Balasore. Khordha including Bhubaneswar, Cuttack and Puri districts were severely affected.

2. Impact/ Extent of Damage:

- In Puri district extensive damages have been occurred to all kutchha houses. Structures of temporary street vendors have been completely damaged. 160 nos. of people have been injured and admitted to hospital for treatment. Special Circuit House Puri, Office and Residence of SP and Collector have been badly damaged like many other buildings.
- Huge numbers of trees have been uprooted resulting in disruption of road communication. Khordha and Bhubaneswar city have been severely affected.
- In Bhubaneswar 03 persons have been injured and hospitalized.
- Power supply snapped due to uprooting of electricity poles, damage to substations and transmission lines.
- Telecom towers have been affected resulting in cellular and telephone network down in wide area. All telephone and cell phones are down in Puri district. Telephone and mobile connectivity has also been severely affected in Khordha including Bhubaneswar city.
- Summer crops, orchards, plantations devastated in a large scale.

3. Action Taken:

- Clearing of roads has already started.
- Power restoration process is in full swing
- Road communication in Ganjam and Gajapati completely restored. Road clearance and restoration works in other districts including Bhubaneswar city is going on.
- Considering the serious disruption of electricity supply, road communication, telephone and mobile connectivity, additional support has been rushed for immediate restoration. Additional teams for road clearance, police for Law and Order, dry food such as Chuda and Gud. polythene mobilized to the district.
- 11,60,529 Persons in 18 districts evacuated and sheltered in 6575 cyclone shelters. Free kitchen opened for them.
- 24,889 numbers of tourists have been safely evacuated from Puri, Ganjam, Cuttack and Balasore districts.
- Nearly 4.5 lakh polythene sheets (temporary shelter materials) have been prepositioned in district/ sub-district levels and 1.5 lakh kept in buffer stock at state HQRS.
- 1 lakh of food packets have been prepared and kept ready for air dropping, if required.
- Cyclone related alert and action suggested have been delivered through Location Based Alert System (LBAS) SMS to 1.8 crore nos. of subscribers of the likely to be affected districts.
- Cyclone warning has been disseminated through siren towers installed in the coastal areas under EWDS project.
- 55 satellite phones have been provided to Districts, response forces and senior officials at state HQRS for emergency communication. 14 more satellite phone provided to coastal district under EWDS project.

4. Deployment of Response Forces:

- 20 ODRAF teams have been deployed for SAR and road clearance in the affected areas.
- 31 NDRF teams have been deployed for SAR and road clearance in the affected areas.
- Additional 04 NDRF teams from the neighbouring NDRF Bn. already reached.

- 12 Additional NDRF Teams have been mobilised for Odisha.
- All Fire Teams have been deployed for SAR and road clearance in the affected areas.

5. Action Taken by Districts:

- 32 no. of Medical teams deployed.
