Analysis of Feedback for First Fortnight of November, 2014

1. REPORTAGE

(i) Defaulters

(ii) Promptness and Punctuality

- ❖ All Collectors have furnished the report within the scheduled time.
- Collectors of all districts are advised to maintain the time schedule even if submission dates fall on Govt. holidays.

2. ANALYSIS AND INFERENCE ON FEED BACKS

(i) <u>Job Seekers</u>

❖ All Collectors except Collector, Boudh and Kendrapara have reported that there were no job seekers available for wage employment without work in their districts. Panchayati Raj Department, which is supervising implementation of Employment Generation Scheme, may cross check.

[Action- Panchayati Raj Department]

❖ The report of Collector, Boudh and Kendrapara indicate existence of 82 and 17 job seekers respectively. The Collector must make required interventions through existing schemes for providing them with wage employment.

[Action- Collector as above]

(ii) Food Security

❖ Reports show that 114 retail outlets have not lifted stock during the fortnight. Collector *Deogarh*, *Bolangir*, *Gajapati*, *Kalahandi*, *Angul*, *Mayurbhanj and Koraput* should pay special attention to bring down the number to nil in the next fortnight.

[Action- Collectors as above]

2666 beneficiaries have not lifted their entitlement under Annapurna Yojana. 845, 704, 399, 339 & 109 families have not lifted their entitlement in Kalahandi, Ganjam, Koraput, Rayagada & Mayurbhanj districts respectively where the nos. are comparatively high.

[Action- Collectors above]

❖ Similarly 23598 families have not lifted their entitlement under Antodaya Anna Yojana. This has decreased compared to the figure of 28648 relating to 1st fortnight of October-2014. The figures in the districts of Rayagada, Ganjam, Koraput, Bolangir, Sundargarh, Mayurbhanj, Kalahandi & Puri are comparatively high.

[Action- Collectors above]

(iii) Social Security & Malnutrition

- ❖ 39 nos. of ICDS centres are not functioning in the district of Jajpur-27, Mayurbhanj-11 & Kalahandi-1 during this fortnight.
- The percentage of Gr.III and Gr.IV children is high in the districts like Mayurbhnaj, Rayagada, Angul, Cuttack, Keonjhar, Khurda, Nuapada, Nawaranghpur, Kalahandi, Jharsuguda, Kandhamal, Koraput & Sundargarh.

[Action- Collectors as above and W. & C.D. Department]

❖ It is seen that 11686 persons have not received their Old age pension / Widow pension. Collectors of Dhenkanal, Angul, Gajapati, Ganjam, Bolangir, Rayagada, Balasore, Baragarh, Kalahandi, Jagatsinghpur, Keonjhar & Sundargarh districts must pay personal attention to this aspect where they are having the maximum no. of persons not receiving the pension.

[Action- Collectors as above]

(iv) Health Care and Safe Drinking Water

- ❖ 1 (one) person died in *Sundargarh* district due to Malaria during this fortnight.
- At the end of the 2nd fortnight of October, 2014, there were 536 habitations without safe drinking water. Now as per the report of the collectors this number is 601. It calls for intervention of Collectors of Nuapada, Koraput, Keonjhar, Kandhamal, Gajapati & Deogarh where the figures are comparatively high.
- The Collectors of aforesaid districts are requested to furnish the details i.e. Name, Tahasil and Block of such habitations at the time of submission of compliance in the next fortnight.

[Action- Collectors as above, Rural Development Department / H & UD Department]

3. SUGGESTIONS

❖ The objective of collecting information from grass root level involving the Panchayati Raj Institutions was to have a broad picture of the constraints and deficiencies, if any, in implementation of various schemes. In the absence of the involvement and commitment from all concerned it will be a futile fortnightly exercise.

[Action- All Collectors]

❖ The Collectors concerned should immediately ascertain as to why a large number of beneficiaries under Annapurna Yojana and Antodaya Arna Yojana have not lifted the stock.

[Action- Collectors concerned]

❖ The Collectors have reported that 0.15 lakh additional beneficiaries need to be covered under supplementary nutrition programme. The W&CD Department may therefore examine the matter and suggest remedial action.

[Action- W. & C.D. Department]

❖ The reports received from the districts reveal that 11686 persons have not received Old age pension/Widow pension. It requires a detailed field verification and substitution in case of death and migration. This has been reiterated time and again. In spite of repeated requests, compliance on this score is not forthcoming. Hence, the Collectors should expedite this and complete the substitution immediately and report compliance.

[Action- All concerned Collectors & W.& C.D. Deptt.]

❖ It is seen from the reports that 601 habitations need provision of Safe Drinking Water immediately. R.D. and H. & U.D. Department should verify the position as claimed by Districts and expedite response in the matter.

[Action- Rural Development and H & U.D. Department]

❖ The number of main bread earners of family suffering from prolonged illness during this fortnight is 1 (Boudh-1).

[Action- Collector as above]

❖ The MIS should not be taken as another routine. The valuable information, which the MIS throws up, should be used for effective intervention.
